

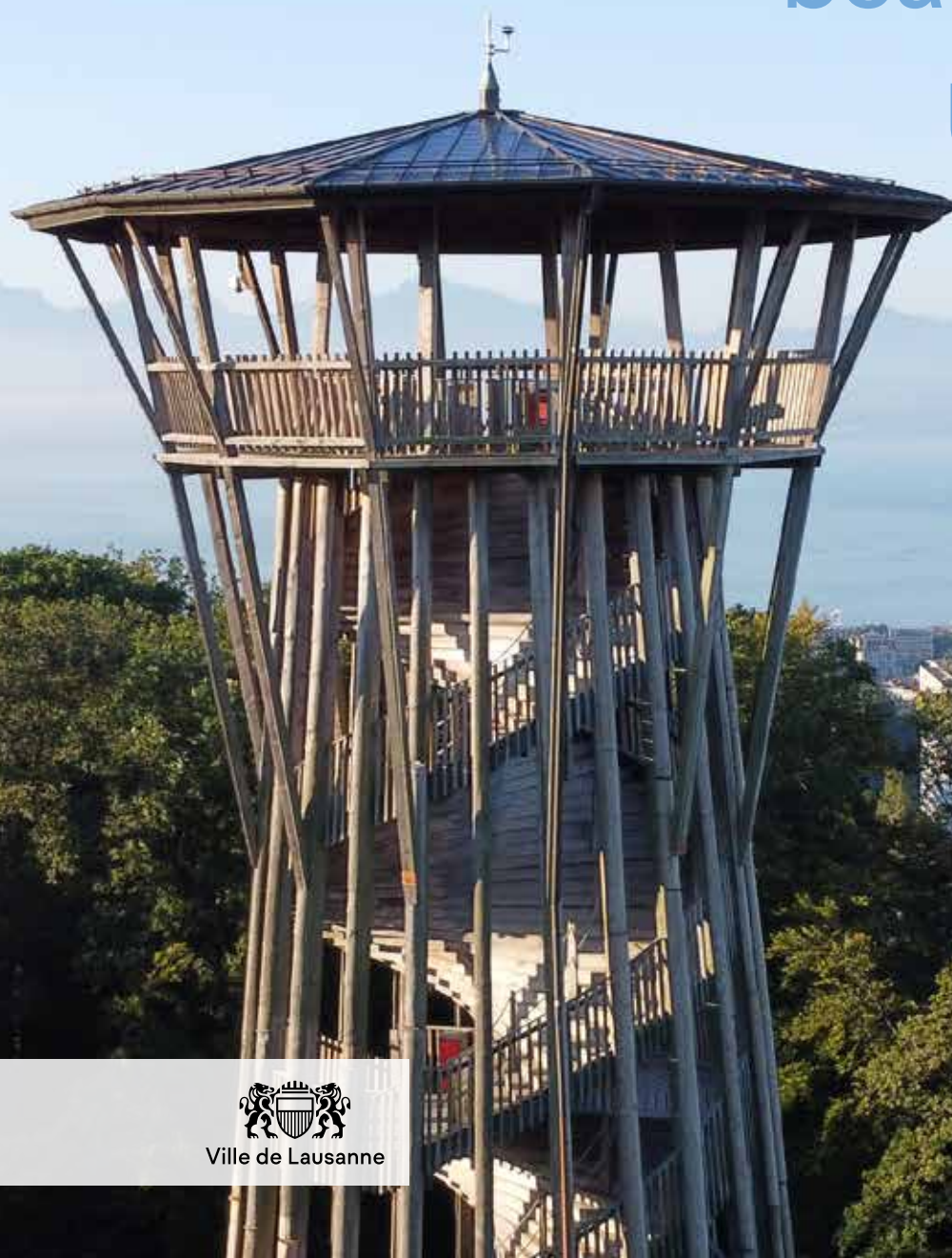

From its observation tower, built in solid wood from local forests, Lausanne offers you a 360-degree panorama of the city, Lake Geneva, the Jura, the Prealps and the Alps. Whether you climb it to find peace, enjoy the view or keep fit, you will find that the Tour de Sauvabelin has become a tourist attraction recognised far and wide.

OPENING TIMES AND ACCESS

Entry to the tower is free. 50 visitors are permitted at any one time, with access through an automatic gate. You can walk to the tower from t1 16 bus stop "Lac de Sauvabelin".



The Tour de Sauvabelin was built on the hills above Lausanne to the highest environmental standards, aiming to be an exemplar of sustainable development.

It was constructed by the Union des Sociétés de Développement de Lausanne (USDL) on the hill where the Sauvabelin drinking water reservoir is located, and has been open to the public since 2003.
